A table top exercise is discussion based. Table Top Exercises use paper and verbal scenarios to evaluate the Emergency Management Plan and procedures effectiveness with a minimum amount of stress. In this session, presenters will explain the purpose, goals, and benefits of hosting a tabletop exercise. Participants will go through the process of developing a tabletop exercise using the DIY Tabletop model. We will also examine the importance of evaluations in exercise.</p>

Emergency Management System, Community Health Care Association of New York State</i></p> <p>An active shooter is an individual actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined and other populated area. In most cases, active shooters use firearms and there is no pattern or method to their selection of victims. Active shooter situations are unpredictable and evolve quickly. All health center employees can help prevent and prepare for potential active shooter situations. This session will provide information and resources about recommended actions for all health center employees to take should they be confronted with an active shooter situation.</p>
