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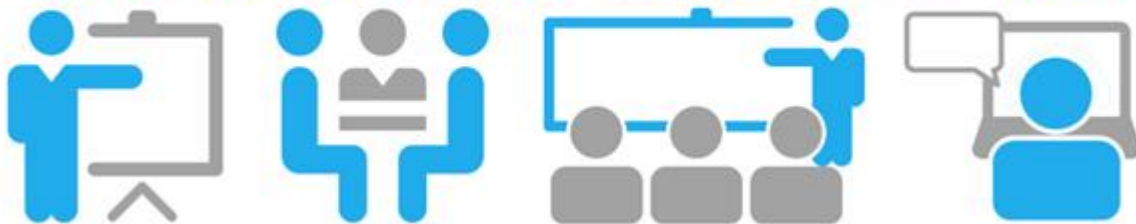

American Cancer Society's HPV Cancer Free Campaign Underway

The American Cancer Society's **Mission: HPV Cancer Free** campaign to eliminate vaccine-preventable HPV cancers, starting with cervical cancer, is now officially underway. The goal is to increase HPV vaccination rates for pre-teen boys and girls to 80% by 2026, 20 years after approval of the first HPV vaccine.
