IMPORTANT: Housing Policy

1. Opportunity to Serve on New Health & Human Services Commission (HHSC) Advisory Committees: Senate Bill 7 and Senate Bill 58, passed by the 83rd Legislature, created several new state advisory committees, including the following:

- Medicaid and CHIP Regional Advisory Committees—These committees make recommendations to the HHSC. There are 13 committees statewide, and applicants may be appointed to a three-year term. [Applications](#) will be accepted through **11:59am August 2nd**.

HHSC is now accepting applications to serve on these committees, and TACHC encourages health center leadership staff to apply for any of the advisory committees, particularly the State Medicaid Managed Care Advisory Committee. Committees must consist of patients, providers, health plans and community stakeholders, and applications are due **August 14th**. This is a great opportunity for health centers to have a seat at the table during discussions to improve Medicaid managed care in Texas. 2. CMS Medicare Administrative Contractor Satisfaction Survey—Your Opinion Counts! The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) is launching a new instrument for 2013 called the Medicare Administrative Contractor Satisfaction Indicator (MSI), a tool that measures your satisfaction with the Medicare Administrative Contractor (MAC) that serves you. This measuring tool will provide the best opportunity for you to rate your satisfaction with your MAC. Your input will help your MAC to improve the services they offer you. Participation is voluntary, but you must register if you would like to take the MSI. A random sample of providers will be drawn from the registry for participation in the survey. Revisions to Requirements for the Joint Commission's Ambulatory Care Standards: The Joint Commission recently approved several revisions to ambulatory care standards to ensure that these accreditation requirements remain relevant. These requirements, located in the "Human Resources" (HR), "Leadership" (LD), "Medication Management" (MM), "National Patient Safety Goals" (NPSG), and "Provision of Care, Treatment, and Services" chapters, were identified as not adding value, needing clarification, or containing language that may not be relevant to all ambulatory settings. For example, several ambulatory care requirements have been modified to reflect how the term *discharge* might apply to certain ambulatory settings (but not to others). The revised elements of performance (EPs) are **effective January 1, 2014**. For more information, click [HERE](#). 1. GSK Waiver of Certain Pre-Book Requirements: TACHC has received word from GlaxoSmithKline (GSK) in regards to centers who have pre-booked their flu vaccine direct from GSK that GSK is waiving two of the pre-book requirements for FLUARIX, FLULAVAL and FLUARIX QUADRIVALENT. These centers will be able to return up to 25% of the FLUARIX and FLULAVAL and up to 100% of the FLUARIX QUADRIVALENT regardless of when they were ordered. 2. HRSA 340B Audit Results: HRSA recently released the summaries of the 16 audits it conducted of 340B eligible entities in 2012. The overview of the audit is in the second attachment to this email for your reference. As you can see, most audits had no findings. A common finding is "incorrect 340B database

record". Please make certain that your center's information (if applicable, including a retail pharmacy being contracted with) is 100% current and accurate in the [OPA's database](#). It is important to check each of the center's sites and the 8 tabs at the top that are associated with each site. If a piece of information is incorrect, most corrections can be made electronically and easily (those that must be done via paper are listed) by clicking [HERE](#).

Subject: Notification of updates in GSK's 2013 Influenza Program

Dear Ms: Lynn Ford

Please be advised that effective July 17, 2013, GlaxoSmithKline is waiving the March 31, 2013 pre-book requirements on FLUARIX (Influenza Virus Vaccine) and FLULAVAL (Influenza Virus Vaccine) and the May 31, 2013 pre-book requirement on FLUARIX QUADRIVALENT (Influenza Virus Vaccine) in order to earn the three percent (3%) 2013 flu advantage discount on these GSK vaccines.

The March 31, 2013 pre-book requirements on FLUARIX and FLULAVAL and the May 31, 2013 pre-book requirement on FLUARIX QUADRIVALENT will also be waived on returns eligibility and Company's Participating Members will be eligible to return up to 25% of their GSK FLUARIX and FLULAVAL Influenza Vaccine doses and up to 100% of their GSK FLUARIX QIV Influenza Vaccine doses regardless of pre-book or purchase date.

All other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
